



2019 Stage 3 Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition

All interested students from Stage 3 will need to prepare a speech for the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition from the topics below. Students will present their speeches to their own class. Each class teacher will judge individual speeches and decide on 2 class representatives to go into the stage finals. The adjudicators will select students from the stage finals to present an impromptu speech with 5 minutes preparation time. Two students from this group will then be selected to represent our school at the local finals.

Requirements

- Class speeches will be due on **Wednesday 15th May** (Term 2, Week 3).
- The prepared speech needs to have a multicultural perspective/content related to the topics below.
- The class teacher will select the two best presentations to represent their class at the stage finals during **Week 5 (Term 2)**.
- The adjudicators will select students to deliver an impromptu speech with 5 minutes preparation time.
- Two students from Stage 3 will then be selected to represent our school at the local finals.
- The duration of prepared speeches should be 4 minutes, and impromptu speeches 2 minutes.

Judging

- Based on preparation, presentation and structure (as per rubric- see over)
- Contestants need to be confident and engaging speakers
- They need to demonstrate an understanding of multiculturalism
- Speeches need to be well developed and interesting
- Contestants need to demonstrate a balance of personal opinion and information
- No props, powerpoints or use of multimedia is allowed during the presentation
- Keeping to the time limit is important
